Illinois Supreme Court

The agency that oversees continuing legal education in Illinois has sent more than 35,000 certification forms to lawyers in the state so they can report their CLE credits.

The Illinois Supreme Court's MCLE Board mailed the forms late last week to lawyers with last names beginning with the letters N through Z. Those lawyers can use an online reporting system at www.mcleboard.org, or can complete and return the form they receive in the mail.

Lawyers whose last names begin with N through Z are required to receive a minimum of 20 hours of MCLE credit or be entitled to claim an exemption by June 30. Those Illinois lawyers whose last names begin with A through M were required to report their MCLE credits in the summer of 2008.
