Around the state

The agency that oversees continuing legal education in Illinois sent more than 56,000 certification forms to lawyers in the state this week so they can report their CLE credits.

The Illinois Supreme Court's MCLE Board mailed the forms to lawyers with last names beginning with the letters A through M. Those lawyers can use an online reporting system at www.mcleboard.org, or can complete and return the form they receive in the mail.

Lawyers whose last names begin with A through M are required to receive a minimum of 24 hours of MCLE credit, or be entitled to claim an exemption, by June 30 and report their MCLE credits by the end of July.
